Horizon Air Adds Larger Aircraft and More Flights

SEATTLE—Horizon Air will resume seasonal flights to three popular ski resorts for the winter and add more flights or larger aircraft on several other routes in the coming months.

Flights will be added using a combination of 74/76-seat Q400 turboprops and 37-seat Q200 turboprops. The schedule increases are as follows (and all are year-round unless otherwise indicated):

Starting Dec. 15

- **Sun Valley:** One daily Q400 flight to/from both Los Angeles and Oakland through April 5. Sun Valley is served year-round with nonstop service from Seattle.
- **Kamloops, B.C.:** One daily Q400 flight to/from Seattle through April 5 to accommodate travel to the Sun Peaks ski resort.
- **Kelowna, B.C.:** Four daily Q400 flights to/from Seattle replacing four daily Q200 flights to accommodate travel to Big White and Silver Star ski resorts. The route will return to four daily Q200 flights on April 6.

Starting Jan. 6

- **Walla Walla:** A fourth daily Q200 flight to/from Seattle.

Starting Feb. 17

- **Yakima:** Two daily Q400 flights and three daily Q200 flights to/from Seattle replacing six daily Q200 flights, resulting in a 17 percent capacity increase.

Starting March 9

- **Pasco:** Six daily Q400 flights and one daily Q200 flight to/from Seattle replacing three daily Q400 flights and four daily Q200 flights, resulting in a 30 percent capacity increase.

Starting April 6

- **Lewiston:** Two daily Q400 flights to/from Boise replacing two daily Q200 flights, resulting in a 100 percent capacity increase. Also, three daily Q400 flights to/from Seattle replacing five daily Q200 flights, resulting in a 20 percent capacity increase.
- **Pullman:** Three daily Q400 flights to/from Seattle replacing four daily Q200 flights, resulting in a 50 percent capacity increase. Also, new one-stop, same-plane Q400 service to/from Boise.

As previously announced, Horizon is beginning new nonstop service between Portland and Santa Rosa on Oct. 28, and is running seasonal nonstop jet service between San Jose and Palm Springs from Nov. 4 through April 6.

The additional seat capacity and flights will help accommodate growing demand for Horizon's service. Horizon has done its part to spur this on, recently cutting fares up to 50 percent on many of its routes, including its popular every-half-hour Horizon Shuttle between Seattle and Portland. Horizon's additional seat capacity and flights also will offer more connections to its sister company, Alaska Airlines, and other airline travel partners.
