**Design Principles Continued...**

- Safety and security concerns have been addressed through the provision of lighting and appropriate crime prevention through environmental design principles.
- Multiple resting/seating opportunities have been provided at strategic locations along the corridor.
- The Lakeshore area character has been incorporated into key design elements and public art suggestions.
- Pedestrians are effectively separated from vehicular traffic. Pedestrian crosswalks have been provided and designed to signify pedestrian priority and safety to reduce vehicle conflicts.
- A high quality of materials utilized in the streetscape/ multi-use corridor will contribute to the creation of a strong civic image.
- Creative way-finding techniques such as paving, street furniture and well designed signage help define the corridor and present a sense of clarity for residents and visitors alike.
