ALTERNATIVES TO BURNING

The Regional Air Quality Program is a joint initiative of the City of Kelowna, the Regional District of Central Okanagan, the District of Peachland, the City of West Kelowna, Westbank First Nation, and the District of Lake Country. The Air Quality Program aims to protect and improve the region's air quality through education, awareness, and pollution prevention initiatives.

The Air Quality program provides <u>alternatives to burning</u> for Central Okanagan residents:

- <u>Free Agricultural Chipping Program</u> for Central Okanagan orchardists who want to chip wood waste from orchard removal. This type of debris typically includes stumps and large branches. To register, please fill out the <u>Online Form</u>. Registration is accepted year-round, and chipping occurs from February through June and September through November. Registering for the program at least one year in advance is recommended.
- Mow-Chip Rent-Buy-it Rebate program Qualifying participants must have a property one hectare or greater in size
 with a small volume of wood for fuel reduction or agricultural activities that cannot be served through the regular
 Agricultural Chipping Program. Apply Online. Limited funding available. Rebates cover chipping costs only and will be
 issued until funds are depleted or November 15, whichever comes first. Submit an itemized invoice clearly showing
 chipping costs to qualify.
 - For Residential Property
 - Rebate money is limited to **80%** of the daily/multi-day/weekly/rental or chipping/flail mow service, **up to a \$500** rebate per applicant. Residents can apply once per year.
 - For Farm Property
 - Rebate up to a maximum of \$3000 for the daily/multi-day/weekly/rental or chipping/flail mow service cost. Farmers can apply once per year.
 - For Residential and Farm property
 - Rebate money for purchasing a new chipper or flail mower up to a maximum of \$1500. This is a one-time purchase rebate per property. The amount granted cannot exceed 50% of the total equipment cost.

• The yard waste drop-off program is available at the <u>Glenmore landfill</u> and <u>Westside Residential Waste Disposal and Recycling Centre</u> (Asquith Road in West Kelowna). Fees apply. When transporting loads for disposal, please make sure they are covered.
