



Canadian Navigable Waters Act

Notice of work over Mill Creek

The City of Kelowna hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Navigable Waters Registry pursuant to the Canadian Navigable Waters Act for public comment described herein and its site and plans.

Pursuant to paragraph 10(1)(b) of the said Act, the City of Kelowna has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 3987, a description of the following work, its site and plans:

To replace the aging wood bridge over Mill Creek on Old Vernon Road with an 11m by 3.1m multi-plate Supercor steel arch culvert on a 13m long reinforced rockfill foundation. The existing concrete footings will be incorporated into the foundation by placement of reinforced rockfill foundation behind the existing concrete footings. New precast footings will be placed on the reinforced rock foundation and the Supercor arch placed on the new footings. The footings will be armoured with rock to protect from scour. The arch is designed to the 200-year flood event level (elevation of 439.92) with a debris clearance of 1.5 m. The arch spans the entire width of Mill Creek at Old Vernon Road approximately 800 m east of Highway 97.
