Paper Cups & Lids

All disposable paper based cups & lids

DO NOT INCLUDE

Straws



Frozen Food Packaging

Rinsed, plastic coated boxes such as ice cream cartons

- Rinsed milk/milk alternative cartons
- Rinsed soup 'tetra-pak' containers

DO NOT INCLUDE

- Straws
- Stand-up drink pouches



Aerosol Cans & Caps

✓ Hairspray, deodorant, shaving cream, air freshener, food based aerosols must be completely empty

DO NOT INCLUDE

Spray paint cans (take to hazardous waste depot)



Aluminum

- Foil & food containers
- Empty & rinse
- Labels are ok



DO NOT INCLUDE

- Chip or foil bags
- Foil wrap from butter or cigarettes



Tin Cans & Lids

- All tin cans, keep lids attached
- I abels are ok



DO NOT INCLUDE

Coat hangers, pots, pans or baking trays (Please donate these items.)







Plastic Containers & Lids

All empty & rinsed household plastic containers with the #1-7 recycle symbols

DO NOT INCLUDE

- Lawn edging, tarps, plastic furniture or toys or garden hoses
- Motor oil or chemical containers (Take these to a depot: see www.usedoilrecycling.com)
- PLASTIC BAGS & STYROFOAM must be taken to DEPOT ONLY



Spiral Wound Paper Cans & Lids

- Frozen juice, coffee cans, chips, baby formula cans
- Put lids in cart loose



Microwaveable Paper Containers

Single serve soups & other paper bowls

DO NOT INCLUDE

Bowls with metal rims



Cardboard & Boxboard

- Clean cardboard boxes, pizza boxes etc.
- Cereal box-type cardboard

DO NOT INCLUDE

Waxed produce boxes

How to Use Your Carts

- All materials must fit within the carts completely with lids closed.
- Do not block bicycle lanes or sidewalks.
 Carts must not be an obstacle for cyclists or pedestrians.
- Extra garbage? Up to two (2) additional garbage bags that display a 'tag a bag' sticker and are not inside a garbage can will be collected.



To reduce conflicts with wildlife please

DO NOT place your carts out before your collection day.

Be Cart Smart

Place your carts properly for collection.

Carts improperly placed may not be emptied.

Park it

On the street, with the wheels against the curb, or on the shoulder (if no curb).

Point it

Point the arrow on the cart lid towards the road.



Space it

Leave at least an arm's length distance on all sides.

GARBAGE: Black Lid

WEEKLY curbside collection of garbage.

Garbage only. Yard and garden waste and recyclables are not permitted in garbage carts (black lid).

Accepted

- Regular garbage
- Kitchen waste
- · Containers with food
- Diapers
- Animal waste, loose grit/sawdust (must be bagged)
- Cling wrap, zipper bags, bubble wrap
- · Broken window glass, mirror, ceramics
- Styrofoam peanuts or chips. Take all other Styrofoam to a depot for recycling.

Not Accepted

- · No liquids
- · No hot ashes
- · No wood, drywall, metal, concrete or bricks
- No renovation material
- No batteries, electronics or small appliances
- No hazardous materials (motor oil, paint, chemicals, pesticides)
- No bulbs or light fixtures (take to depot)
- No recyclables, incl. cardboard or paper
- · No yard/garden waste
- No Styrofoam or glass (take to depot)

RECYCLABLES Blue Lid

BI-WEEKLY curbside collection of recyclable materials.

Mix all recyclables and leave materials loose in the cart.

DO NOT place recyclables in bags.

Take all glass containers and refundable beverage containers to a bottle depot.

Do not pack materials into the cart: it will not empty when dumped.

- Cardboard & boxboard
- Paper, including newspaper, flyers, magazines, catalogues, gift wrap
- Shredded paper (place in clear plastic bag only)

Containers

- Tin and aluminum cans, aluminum foil and lids
- Spiral wound paper cans
- Milk & milk alternative cartons (e.g. soy, almond milk)
- Empty aerosol cans
- Disposable paper and plastic cups
- Plastic containers (emptied and rinsed)
- Plastic garden pots and trays
- · Frozen food packaging

- No plastic bags (take to depot)
- No Styrofoam or glass (take to depot)
- · No books (please donate)
- No cling wrap, bubble wrap or zipper bags
- No foil gift wrap
- No light bulbs or light fixtures (take to depot)
- No mirror or ceramics
- · No needles or medical waste
- No motor oil, chemical containers or paint cans
- · No diapers
- No batteries, electronics or small appliances (take to depot)
- No used clothing (donate)
- No scrap metal, wood or renovation material
- No plastic toys, storage bins, pails larger than 25 L
- No propane cylinders, spray paint cans

YARD AND GARDEN WASTE:

Green Lid

BI-WEEKLY curbside collection of yard and garden waste, March 1st to November 30th. Put all yard waste loosely into cart.

Residents are encouraged to grasscycle and compost.

NO plastic bags,

no paper bags, no biodegradable bags, no containers.

Do not pack materials into the cart; it will not empty when dumped.

Yard or garden waste is not permitted in the garbage cart.

- · Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Weeds
- · Plant trimmings
- Prunings and branches up to 5cm (2in) in diameter AND less than 1m (3ft) long
- Pine needles & cones
- Pumpkins
- Fruit droppings

Yard waste must fit in cart with lid closed

- No plastic, paper or compostable bags
- No dirt, sod, rocks or tree stumps
- · No kitchen or food waste
- · No diapers
- No used tissue or paper towels
- No regular garbage
- · No animal feces or kitty litter
- No construction or renovation materials
- No agricultural or commercial waste
- · No landscape fabric or plastic edging
- No plastic flower pots (recycle in blue lid cart)

NO yard waste collection December, January or February.


How to use this calendar


Step 1: Refer to the map for your area to determine your collection day.





Wood Stove Exchange Program

Exchange your old wood stove for a new certified appliance and earn a **cash rebate of \$250** (plus dealer discounts may apply).

Open Burning Season: Oct. 1 - Apr. 30

After obtaining a permit for open burning, check air quality conditions online or call 1-855-262-BURN (2876) before you burn.

Burning Best Practices

- · Burn only clean, dry wood
- Never burn garbage
- Never burn green, painted or treat wood
- Properties greater than 1 hectare may apply for an open burning permit (Oct. 1 - April 30).

Contact Fire Dispatch if you suspect someone is burning without a permit or the specific requirements are not met, 250-469-8577.

Food waste is often the largest component of our waste stream once we recycle.

Tips for reducing and eliminating food waste:

- Shop wisely: plan ahead, buy only what you need and use up left overs.
- Use a Backyard Composter to compost vegetable and fruit peelings, coffee grounds, tea bags and egg shells.
 Visit regionaldistrict.com/compostersale to purchase a composter.
- Use a Food Digester, such as a Green Cone, to deal with ALL food waste including table scraps, pasta, breads, meats and bones.
- Worm bins are perfect for small apartments or condos.
 Red Wiggler worms eat fruit and vegetable peelings.

- Prunings and branches up to 5cm (2 in) in diameter AND less than 1m (3 ft) long




Keep our community clean: Put a stop to illegal dumping.






Each and every item we use each day has to be made, or grown, packaged, shipped, purchased, consumed and eventually entirely or partially thrown away. It takes a lot of resources to maintain our consumption.

Reduce waste with these tips:

- 1. **Buy Less.** Do you really need that item?
- 2. **Rent or borrow** an item rather than purchasing it.
- 3. Reuse existing items. Repurpose them for a new use.
- 4. Repair, rather than replace. Patch holes in clothes, have your small appliance fixed.
- Buy reusables including cloth shopping bags, refillable water bottles, cloth napkins and more.
- Buy second hand items from the classifieds or local thrift shops.





Bears are looking for just one thing: food!

They have the nose to find it, and the memories to come back for more.

Help prevent bears and other wildlife from becoming a problem in your neighbourhood:

- Put garbage out at 7am on your collection morning ONLY; not the night before.
- Clean garbage carts regularly.

- Store your waste containers in a secure location: a locked garage, shed or basement.
- Keep your BBQ clean; store pet food indoors; take bird feeders down during bear season.
- Pick fruit from trees as soon as it is ripe; remove all fallen fruit from the ground.

Mulched or shredded leaves are a great source of nutrients and protection for your lawn and garden. Mulching helps keep moisture in, slows evaporation and chokes out weeds.

For best results, shred leaves when they are dry. Mow slowly over areas where there are lots of leaves. (Mow twice, or buy a mulching blade from a hardware store.)

In fall, spread leaf mulch on gardens and around shrubs as winter protection.

Save some of your leaf supply to add to your composter year round.

Yard Waste is collected at the curb from March through November on the days indicated throughout this calendar. Or bring it to the Glenmore Landfill or Westside Residential Disposal Centre year-round for free (up to 250kg). For a complete list of acceptable items to put in your yard waste cart, visit **regionaldistrict.com/recycle.**





Next time something breaks, consider these great 'rules' of the Fixer's Manifesto:

- 1. If it's broken, fix it! Repair is a challenge in creativity. Use your imagination and see what you can come up with to fix your broken item.
- 2. **To repair is to discover.** As you fix things, you will learn what makes them tick.
- 3. **Repairing is about independence.** Don't be a slave to technology; try to be its master. If you are a master, share your knowledge.
- 4. You can repair anything, even a plastic bag; But we recommend getting a bag that will last longer, and then repairing it if necessary.
