
KELOWNA POPULATION STATISTICS*

Prepared by Planning and Development Services Department

The data presented here summarizes the major results of the 2006 Canada Census, carried out nation-wide in May 2006.

POPULATION:

- As of the 2006 census Kelowna's total population was 106,707. (Kelowna's population for 2008 is estimated at 113,000.)
- The population has grown 10.8% between 2001 and 2006 census (an annual growth rate of 2.16%).
- 22% of the population was under 20 years old.
- 19% of the population was over the age of 65.


PREVIOUS RESIDENCE

Information is gathered on the previous residence of respondents living in Kelowna at the time of the census. Information is gathered on respondents' residence in the last year and 5 years. "Non-migrants" changed residences within the City of Kelowna only. "Migrants" were from out of the city.

MOBILITY STATUS 1 YEAR AGO

The majority of those new to Kelowna in the past year had moved from within British Columbia (4% of respondents), or within Canada (2% of respondents).

POPULATION GROWTH

Kelowna's rate of growth has been significant over the past 10 years. The population has grown from 61,950 in 1986 to 106,707 in 2006. Over this 20 year period, there has been a total growth rate of 72%, or 3.6% annually. There was a large amount of growth in the early 1990's, which has slowed in recent years.



EDUCATION, WORK FORCE & INCOMES:

- 23% of the population between the ages of 25 64 hold a post-secondary degree or diploma.
- The median income of all persons 15 years and over was \$25,134. This was less than for the Province of British Columbia at \$25,615, and less than all of Canada at \$26,850.
- 65% of the population 15 years and over was in the work force: 70% of men; 60% of women.
- The average income for women full-time in the workforce was \$37,869.
- The average income for men full-time in the work force was \$46,355.




OCCUPATIONS IN THE WORKFORCE

LANGUAGES AND ETHNICITY

ETHNICITY (BROAD CATEGORIES)

People of British Isles origins represent just over half (53.1%) of the population of the City of Kelowna. Western European origins represent 30.7% of the population. In general, the City of Kelowna is less ethnically diverse than BC overall. Percentages total more than 100% because people selected multiple ethnicities.

ETHNICITY (DETAILED CATEGORIES)

One third (33.2%) of residents identified English as an ethnic origin compared to 29.6% for BC overall. The next most common ethnicity was German (24.4%), and Scottish (23.9%). Percentages total more than 100% because people selected multiple ethnicities.

HOME LANGUAGE

Home language refers to the language that was most often spoken at home by the individual at the time of the census. Almost all residents of the City of Kelowna spoke English as their home language 95.5% compared to 83.6% for BC overall. Punjabi was the next most common home language (0.8%), followed by German (0.8%), and Chinese (0.5%).
