Paper Cups & Lids

✓ All disposable paper based cups & lids

DO NOT INCLUDE

X Straws, stir sticks



Frozen Food Packaging

✓ Rinsed, plastic coated boxes such as ice cream cartons



Cartons (plastic coated)

- ✓ Rinsed milk/milk alternative cartons
- ✓ Rinsed soup 'tetra-pak' containers

DO NOT INCLUDE

- X Straws
- X Stand-up drink pouches



Aerosol Cans & Caps

✓ Hairspray, deodorant, shaving cream, air freshener, food based aerosols must be completely empty

DO NOT INCLUDE

Spray paint cans (take to hazardous waste depot)



Aluminum

- ✓ Foil & food containers
- ✓ Empty & rinse
- ✓ Labels are ok

DO NOT INCLUDE

- X Chip or foil bags
- X Foil wrap from butter or cigarettes



Tin Cans & Lids

- ✓ All tin cans, keep lids attached
- ✓ Labels are ok

DO NOT INCLUDE

Coat hangers, pots, pans or baking trays (Please donate these items.)



Plastic Containers & Lids

All empty & rinsed household plastic containers

DO NOT INCLUDE

- Lawn edging, tarps, plastic furniture or toys or garden hoses
- Motor oil or chemical containers (Take these to a depot; see www.usedoilrecycling.com)

PLASTIC BAGS & STYROFOAM must be taken to DEPOT ONLY



Paper, Newspaper, Magazines

- Newspapers, flyers & inserts, white and coloured paper & magazines, catalogues, phone books, pet food bags (not foil lined)
- Shredded paper accepted inside a CLEAR plastic bag

DO NOT INCLUDE

- Carbon paper, used tissue or paper towels, foil gift wrap, ribbons, bows, padded envelopes
- Books (please donate)



Spiral Wound Paper Cans & Lids

- ✓ Frozen juice, coffee cans, chips, baby formula cans
- ✓ Put lids in cart loose



Microwaveable Paper Containers

✓ Single serve soups & other paper bowls

DO NOT INCLUDE

X Bowls with metal rims



Cardboard & Boxboard

- ✓ Clean cardboard boxes, pizza boxes etc.
- ✓ Cereal box-type cardboards

DO NOT INCLUDE

Waxed produce boxes

How to Use Your Carts

- Do not block bicycle lanes or sidewalks. Carts must not be an obstacle for cyclists or pedestrains.
- Extra garbage? Up to two (2) additional garbage bags that will be collected.



Be Cart Smart

Place your carts properly for collection.



GARBAGE:

Black Lid

WEEKLY curbside collection of garbage.

Garbage must fit in cart with lid closed.

Preparation

Garbage only. Yard and garden waste and recyclables are not permitted in garbage carts (black lid).

Accepted

- ✓ Regular garbage
- Kitchen waste
- Containers with food
- Diapers
- ✓ Animal waste, loose grit/sawdust (must be bagged)
- Cling wrap, zipper bags, bubble wrap
- ✓ Broken window glass, mirror, ceramics
- ✓ Styrofoam peanuts or chips. Take all other Styrofoam to a depot for recycling.

Not Accepted

- X No liquids
- X No hot ashes
- X No wood, drywall, metal, concrete or bricks
- X No renovation material
- X No batteries, electronics or small appliances
- X No hazardous materials (motor oil, paint, chemicals, pesticides)
- X No bulbs or light fixtures (take to depot)
- X No recyclables, incl. cardboard or paper
- X No yard/garden waste
- No Styrofoam or glass (take to depot) p.3


Step 3: Place your yard waste at the road on the alternate weeks with the symbol (March to November only).

WOODSTOVE EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Exchange your old wood stove for a new certified appliance and earn a cash rebate of \$250 (plus dealer discounts may apply).

- Burn only clean, dry wood (less than 20% moisture)
- Never burn garbage
- Never burn green, painted or treated wood

OPEN BURNING SEASON

Properties greater than 1 hectare may apply for an open burning permit (Oct 1-Apr 30)

- After obtaining a permit for open burning, check air quality conditions online or call 1-855-262-BURN (2876) before you burn
- Only Burn prunings, branches, tree trunks which have been DRY for at least two years

 Contact Fire Dispatch if you suspect someone is burning without a permit or the specific requirements are not met, 250-469-8577.

OKANAGAN INVASIVE SPECIES

Tyria Jacobaeae – Tansy Ragwort Bioagent



- Tansy Ragwort in an invasive species from the sunflower family.
- Alkaloids within the plant make it toxic to livestock causing liver damage.
- It is an aggressive plant that can reduce pasture land.

To control invasive species on your property, cut and remove them from the site

Regular weed maintenance reduces the spread of invasive species to neighboring properties.

RECYCLABLES (Bi-weekly collection)

Include:

- Newspapers and flyers
- Paper including envelopes, paper bags, magazines
- Boxboard, including cereal boxes, etc
- Cardboard
- Plastic containers (empty and rinsed)
- Paper cups and lids
- Milk, juice and soup containers
- · Aerosol cans and lids
- Aluminum foil wrap and containers
- Tin and aluminum cans

YARD/GARDEN WASTE (Bi-weekly collection, March – November)

Include:

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Weeds
- Plant trimmings
- Pine needles and cones
- Pumpkins
- Fruit droppings
- Prunings and branches up to 5cm (2 in) in diameter AND less than 1m (3 ft) long





Reduce your need for plastic shopping bags with these tips:

- Use reusable bags, boxes, backpacks or carts for your shopping.
- Say NO to plastic bags at the cash register if you only have a few items.
- Put purchases in a bag you're already carrying.
- Don't take a bag unless you really nee it. Make sure each bag holds at least eight items, and avoid double-bagging

Composting is a natural process in which organic materials decompose, and become a nutrient-rich soil amendment. It aids erosion control, promotes soil fertility, and stimulates healthy root development. And it cuts down on valuable waste going to landfills.

Composting can take 3 to 18 months, depending upon how well the pile is maintained. Compost is ready when its texture is crumbly and it has a pleasant, earthy smell.

Tips for successful composting:

- Keep your compost pile moist, but not wet.
 Add dry materials such as shredded paper, if it is too wet.
- Aerate by turning it occasionally. A dry or frozen pile decomposes more slowly, as does one that is never turned.
- Avoid thick layers of any one material, such as grass.
- Layer "brown" materials e.g. dried leaves, dead plants and shredded newspaper), with "green" materials (e.g. plant trimming and fruit and vegetable peels and cores).

- A one-inch (2.5cm) layer of finished compost or garden soil spread on top of kitchen scraps will speed things up.
- Bury fruit and vegetable trimmings at least 6 inches deep.
- Smaller pieces decompose faster.
- Avoid composting meat, fish or dairy items as well as: bones, pet waste/litter, cooking oil, rhubarb leaves, and toxic or diseased plants and weeds.

Yard waste must fit in your cart with lid closed. No plastic or paper bags please!

Include: Grass clippings, leaves, weeds, plant trimmings, pine needles and cones, pumpkins, fruit droppings, prunings and branches up to 5cm (2 in) in diameter AND less than 1m (3ft) long.

Not Accepted: Kitchen scraps, rocks, dirt, sod, tree stumps, larger branches, painted or treated wood and animal droppings.

Mulched or shredded leaves are an excellen source of nutrients and protection for your lawn and garden. It chokes out weeds, too.

Here are some tips to help you.

Shred leaves when they are dry

- Push mower slowly over areas with lots of leaves; you may have to run over them twice.
- Dig them directly into your garden.
- Spread leaf mulch on gardens and around shrubs and trees as winter protection.
 Leave some space around shrubs and trees. Mulch is most effective when it is 6-7 cm (2 to 3 in) deep.
- Don't forget to compost any leftovers

Have more yard waste or leaves than will fit in your cart. Bring it to (up to 250kg) to the Glenmore Landfill for free, or the Westside Residential Waste Disposal Center year round (fees apply) For a complete list of acceptable items to put in your yard waste cart, visit regionaldistrict.com/recycle.
